

PAWRUS® SCHOLARSHIP ESSAY

You will need to submit a scholarship essay of around 500 words, outlining your academic and non-academic history, as well as any relevant experience.

Your scholarship essay is an important part of your application: it will help scholarship officers to decide whether you are a good match for the Scholarship you have applied for and, just as importantly, whether the Scholarship is right for you.

Your scholarship essay gives you the opportunity to outline your academic and non-academic history, as well as any relevant experience in order to demonstrate that you are a suitable candidate for the Scholarship you have applied for.

You should also use your scholarship essay to outline your motivation for your chosen specialisation. Try to answer questions such as:

- Why are you interested in studying and working at Pawrus®?
- Why have you chosen this specialisation?
- What are your career plans and how will the Pawrus® Scholarship support these?
- Why do you think you are worthy of a Pawrus® Scholarship?
- If you are awarded the Pawrus® Scholarship, in what way do you think you can contribute to Pawrus® subsequently?

Length and writing style

Your personal statement should be no more than 3,500 characters (approximately 500 words) in length and should be written in formal English, using appropriate grammar and punctuation.

It is a good idea to ask a friend to proofread your statement for you before you submit your application.
